

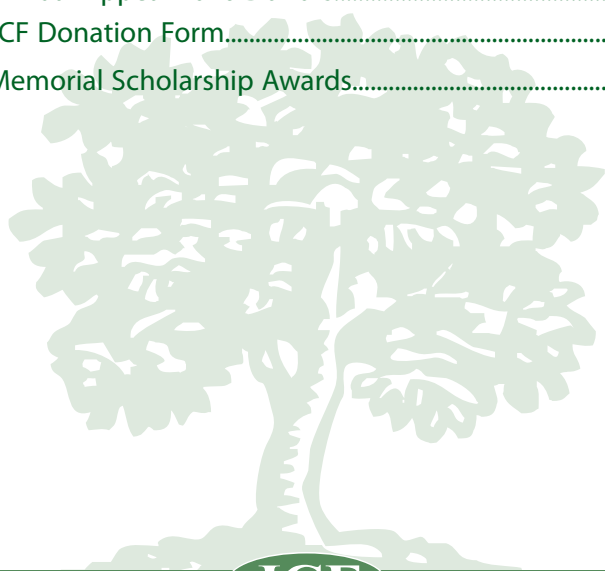

## A Special Message from the Board of Directors

This year the foundation's endowment fund reached a milestone topping \$500,000. The fund has grown from an original amount of \$64,000. The foundation has built the endowment through the annual appeals and memorial donations. We have gone through good and bad economic times but the board stayed focused managing their investment over time. The endowment fund was created as a permanent source of income to improve health care services at Cary Medical Center. In these uncertain times in health care, knowing that we are building a substantial and permanent endowment that will, at some future point, provide additional funds to the hospital for the purchase of new technology, a special capital need or other project can be very reassuring. We are so grateful to the hundreds of donors who have made this possible.

The endowment fund is one of our key development objectives, but we have also generated more than \$1 million in support of major hospital projects including the Building for Specialty Clinics and Oncology, The Center for Women & Children's Health, The Women's Imaging Center, and the Jefferson Cary Cancer Center.

The foundation also manages and awards scholarship funds, memorial funds, and provides support for special initiatives. A major project of the foundation is the Annual Cary Classic Golf Tournament which has raised more than \$250,000 and is the foundation's major annual fundraising event.

The generosity of our donors has been key to the success of our fundraising. The board of directors is so impressed with the support we have received over the years from our generous donors. This level of philanthropy is absolutely critical for the hospital to meet the growing healthcare needs of our community. Our sincere thanks to you for your continued support of our fundraising efforts.

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## Sappier wins Cary Classic in sudden-death playoff



Sheldon Sappier of Tobique First Nation, New Brunswick, defeated Phil Pelletier of Presque Isle in a four-hole play-off to take top honors in the Cary Classic Benefit Golf Tournament.

After being rained out on Saturday, the tourney was held Sunday, July 9, at the Caribou Country Club. Both Sappier and Pelletier finished their 18-hole rounds with scores of 74, forcing the play-off.

Sappier, who plays out of the Aroostook Valley Country Club, drained a 10-foot putt on the third play-off hole to stay alive. Both golfers had powerful drives and chips onto the green on the next hole, but Pelletier's six-footer rolled off the cup, setting up Sappier's four-foot birdie putt to end it.

The women's competition was captured by Emily Jose of Caribou, whose score of 82 was seven strokes better

than runner-up Betty Deveau, also of Caribou.

The Cary Classic had its largest field in several years as it changed its format from a two-day, 36-hole event to a one-day 18-hole tourney. In its 34th year, the Cary Classic is organized by the Jefferson Cary Foundation and features Katahdin Trust Company as the major sponsor.

"We think the change to a one-day tournament has a number of positive considerations," Mary Harrigan, who chairs the tournament planning committee. "A two-day commitment during our short summer season is hard on families and by going to a one-day event we were able to schedule a rain date which worked out very well for us this year. Since the inception of the tournament, it has raised more than \$250,000 to improve health care services at Cary Medical Center. Over the past three years, funds raised have supported the new Jefferson Cary Cancer Center at Cary.

Peter Doebener, president of the Jefferson Cary Foundation Board of Directors, said that the support of the golfers and the quality of the Caribou course made for a very special event. "The Caribou Country Club course is in the best condition in recent memory. The crew really did an outstanding job getting the course ready, members of the country club tournament committee volunteered their time at the event, and our golfers, many who have played the Cary since the beginning, really turned out. It makes all the work going into the event worth the effort".

Another change in the tournament concerned prizes, which this year were all gift cards with \$300 going to the male and female overall winners. Approximately \$6,000 was awarded in gift cards and trophies. In addition, each golfer received a polo shirt sponsored by the hospital's medical staff. Free hamburgers and hot dogs were served out on the course during play and free hors d'oeuvres were featured during the post play reception. Plans are already underway to mark next summer's 35th playing of the Cary Classic.

# MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

## *Reuben and Annette Cote Family Memorial Scholarship Awarded to a Cary Medical Center Nurse*

The Reuben and Annette Cote Family Memorial Scholarship was established by their family many years ago to support ongoing nursing education at Cary Medical Center. The family was so impressed by the care that Annette received during her hospitalization at Cary in the mid-1980's, that they established a scholarship in her memory that is awarded annually to a Cary Medical Center employee furthering his/her education in the nursing field. The scholarship funds are administered by the the Jefferson Cary Foundation, (JCF).

Receiving the 2016 Scholarship Award of \$750 is Kim Wilcox, RT(R)(MR)(M), CN-BI, of Presque Isle. Kim was a Radiologic Technologist and Patient Navigator at Cary prior to returning to college to further her education in the nursing field. Kim is currently enrolled in the Nursing Program at Northern Maine Community College. Her plans are then to continue with the Family Nurse Practitioner Program at Husson University, specializing in geriatrics and pharmacology.
