

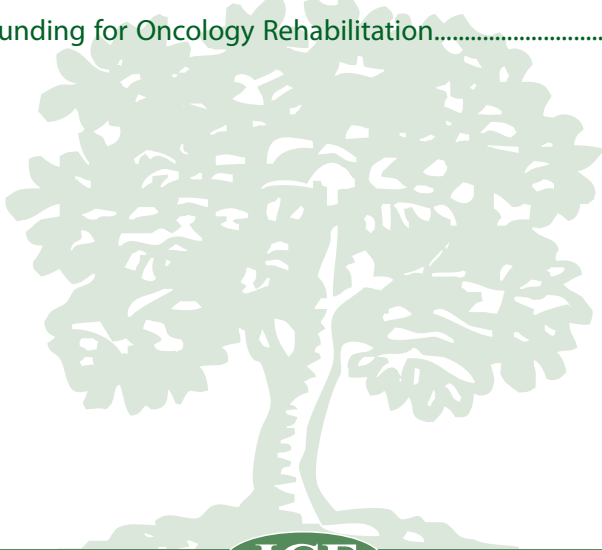

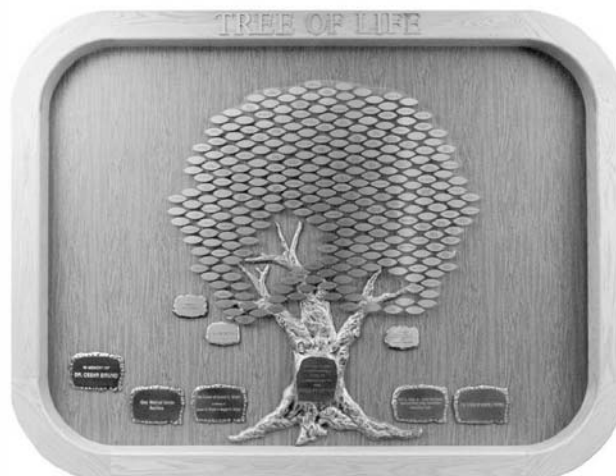

Cary Tournament Another 'Classic' Sun Drenched Event Draws Top Talent

The 30th Annual Cary Classic Benefit Golf Tournament, sponsored by the Jefferson Cary Foundation was held on July 13th and 14th, 2013, at the Caribou County Club. This year's overall Tournament Champions were Ralph Michaud of Fort Fairfield, with a 36-hole gross score of 149; and Emily Jose of Caribou, with a gross score of 168.

This year's tournament drew some outstanding golf talent to the Caribou Country Club for the two-day medal play tournament. Drenched in sunshine for the entire week-end, some 70 golfers competed for more than \$8,000 in prizes. Ralph Michaud of the Aroostook Valley Country Club, and a past winner of the Cary Classic, was the tournament champion with a 36-hole gross score of 149. Steve Clark finished second with a score of 152. For the third year in a row, and for a fourth Cary Classic win, perennial champion, Emily Jose of the Caribou Country Club, took the top spot for the ladies play with a gross score of 168, followed by Vi Kemp of Palmyra in second, with a score of 171.

The winner of the Longest Drive for the men was Tim Gagnon; and for the women was Dorina Martin. The winner of the Closest to the Pin for the men was Carl Flynn, MD; and for the women was Stephanie Flagg.

The tournament serves as one of the largest annual fundraising events for the Jefferson Cary Foundation, with proceeds going toward the new Women's Imaging Center at Cary Medical Center.

Reuben & Annette Cote Family Memorial Scholarship

The Jefferson Cary Foundation is pleased to announce that two Cary nurses have received the Reuben & Annette Cote Family Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship was established by their family many years ago to support ongoing nursing education at the hospital. The family was so impressed by the care that Annette received during her hospitalization at Cary in the mid-1980's, that they established a scholarship in her memory that is awarded annually to a Cary Medical Center nurse furthering his or her education in the nursing field.

In 2013, two Cary Nurses each received \$750.00 scholarship awards. They are Anne-Marie Davenport, RN, BSN, CWCN, Wound Ostomy Nurse in Cary's Specialty Clinic; and Lauren Walker, RNC, BSN, Maternal/Child Nurse at Cary.

Anne-Marie will complete a Foot and Nail Care Course this spring through an on-line Web WOC Continuing Education Program from Minneapolis, MN. Upon completion, she will receive certification from the Wound, Ostomy and Continence Nursing Certification Board.
